Methodology

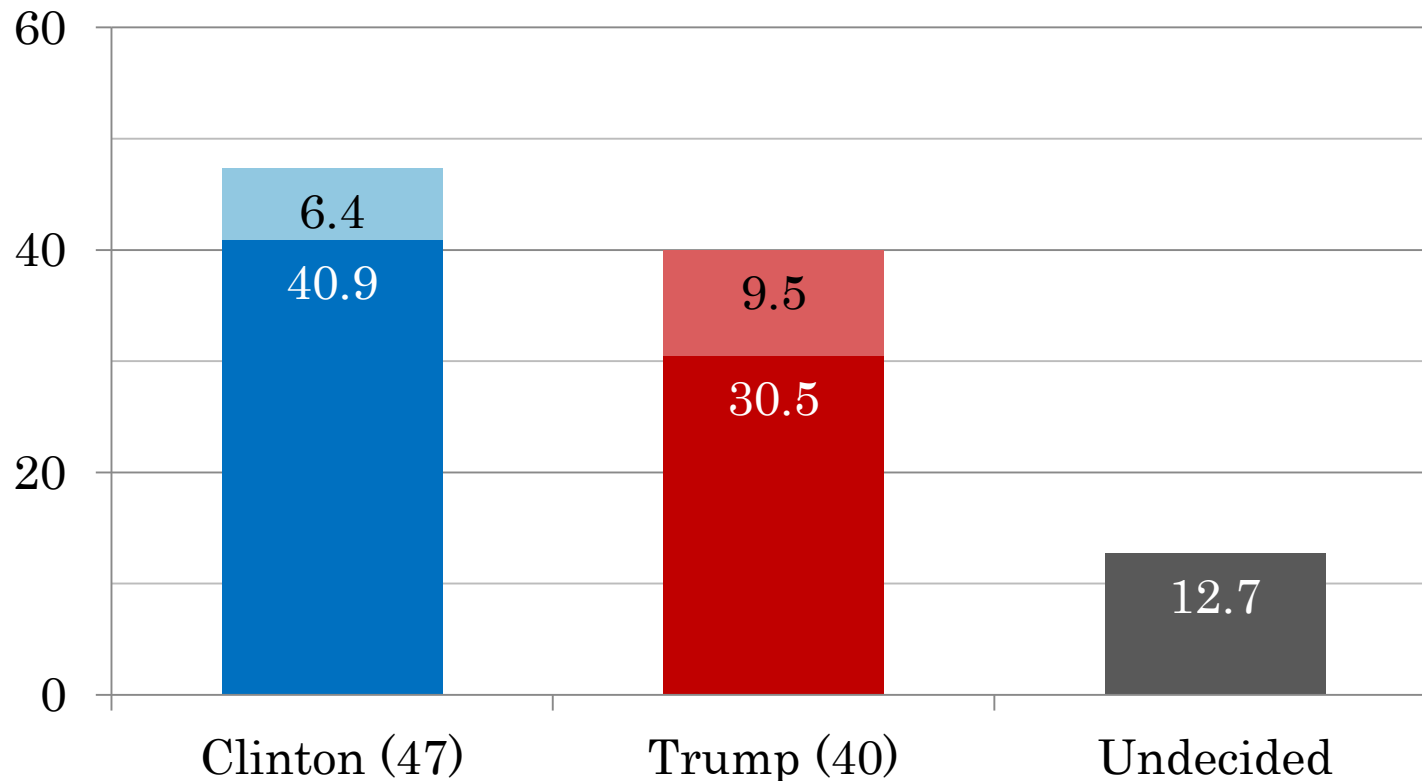
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- A survey of 812 likely Maine voters was conducted by phone and online from October 24th-26th, 2016.
- Survey results were mathematically weighted by gender, age and geographic area to ensure an accurate representation of the population being surveyed. The sample was not weighted by party.
- The sample margin of error of this survey is 3.4%, 95 times out of 100. Sub-samples may have a larger margin of error.
- Frequencies and percentages may not always add up to the total number of responses or to 100%, due to weighting and rounding.

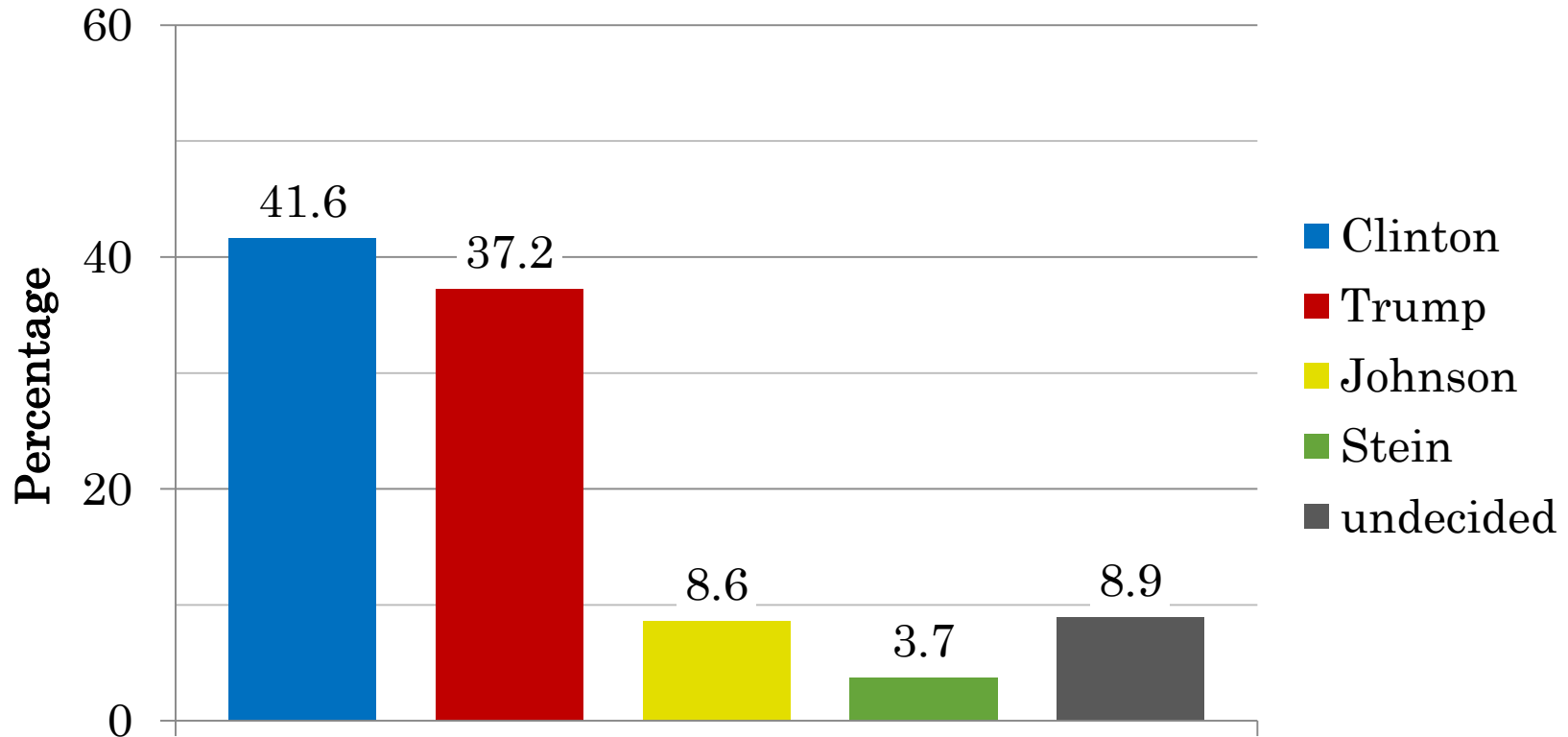
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If the election for President were held today and the candidates were Democrat Hillary Clinton and Republican Donald Trump, for whom would you vote?

Four-Way Statewide Presidential

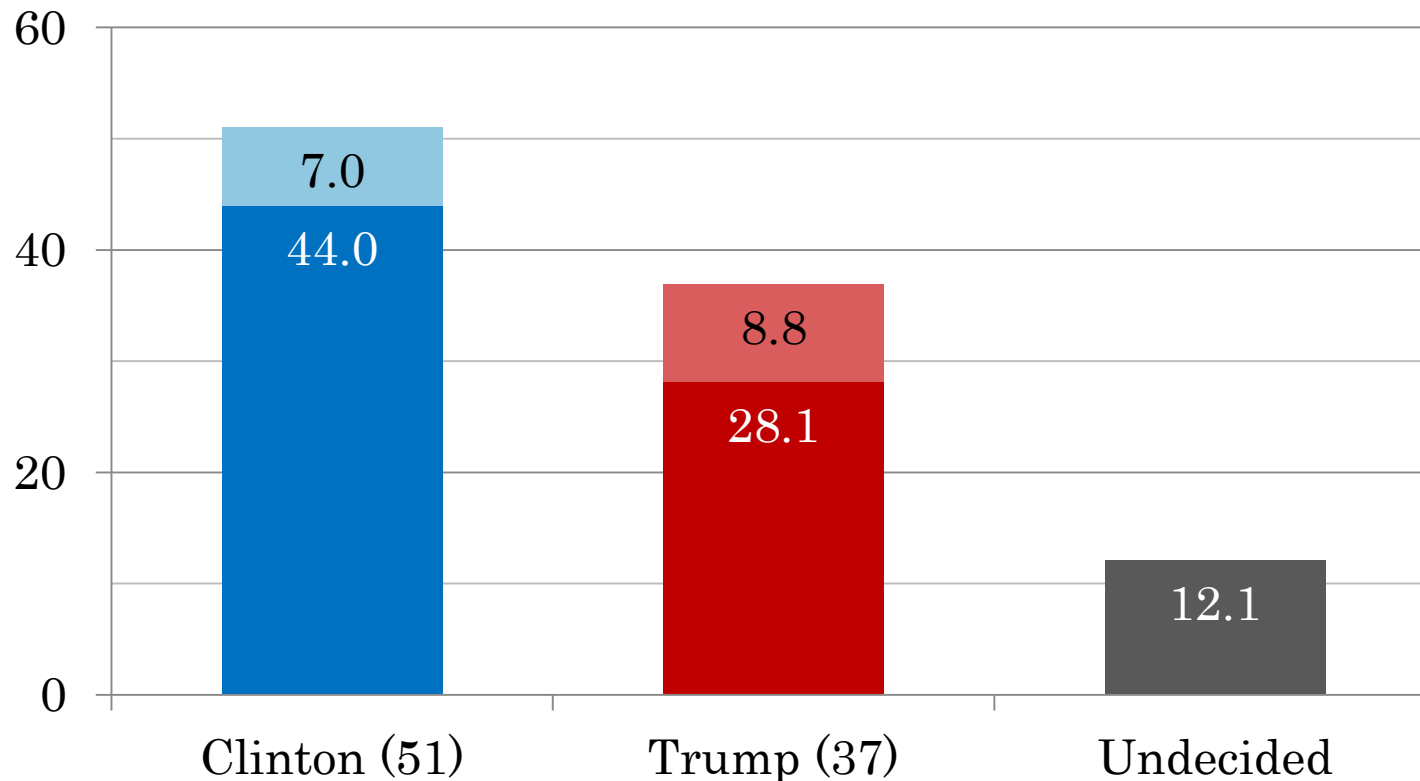

Two-Way CD1 Presidential

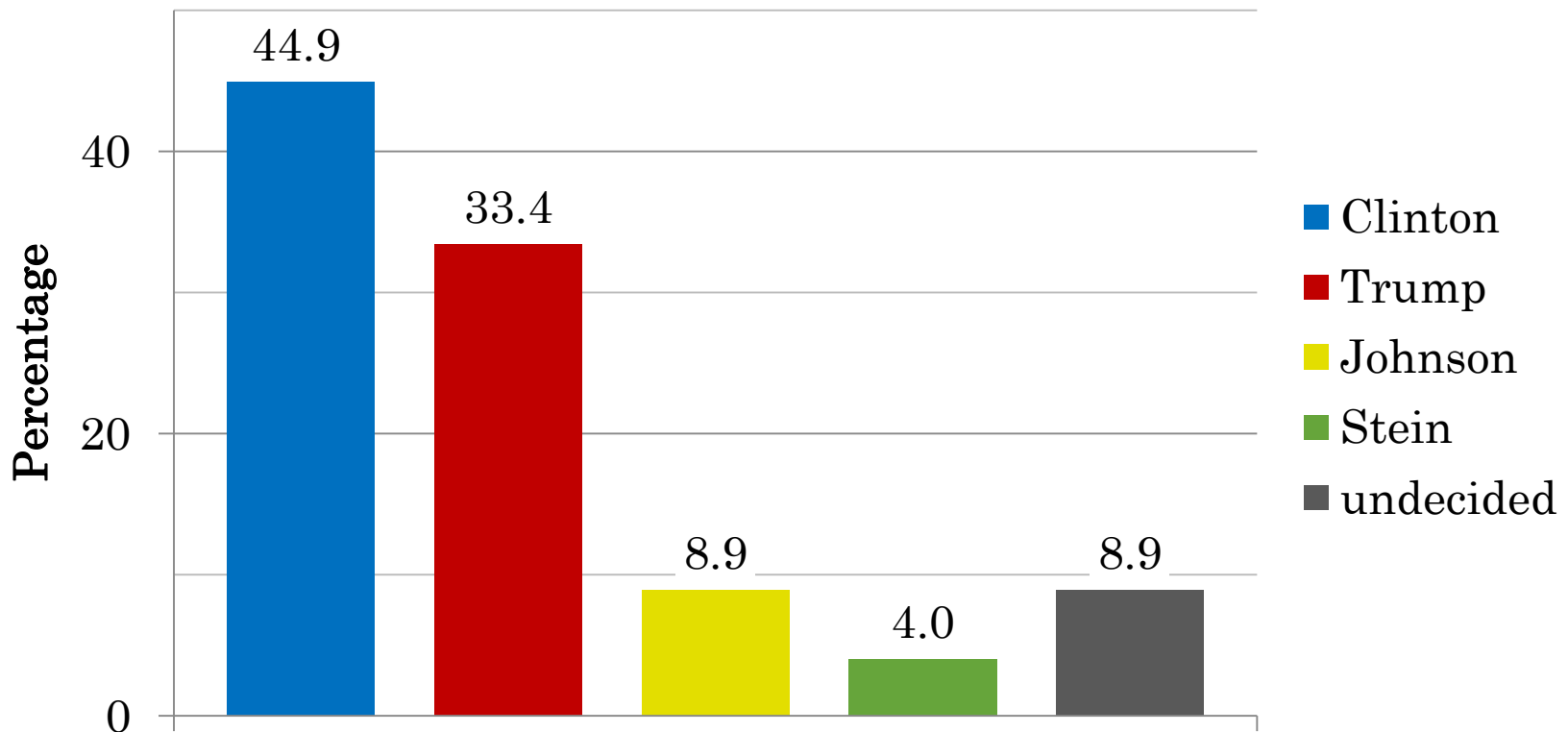

Four-Way CD1 Presidential

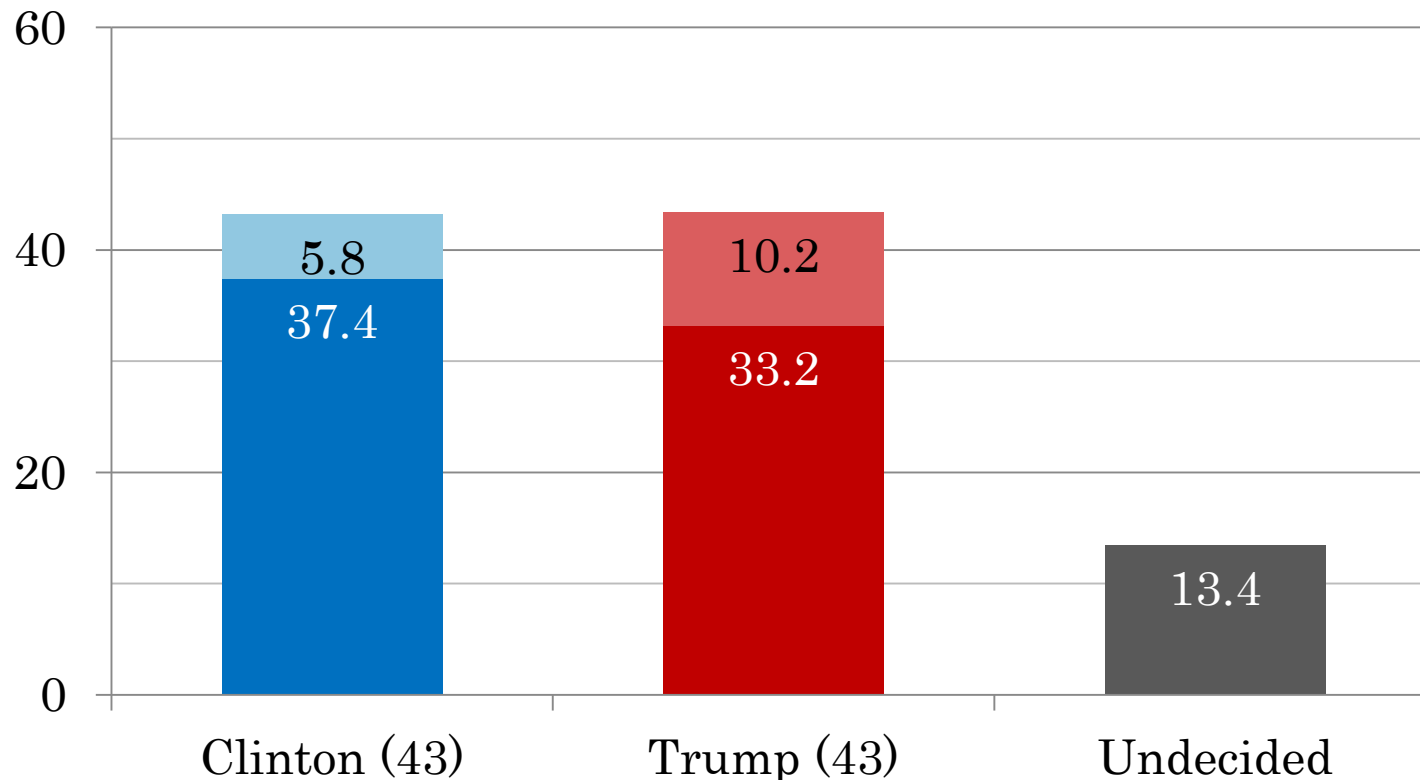

Two-Way CD2 Presidential

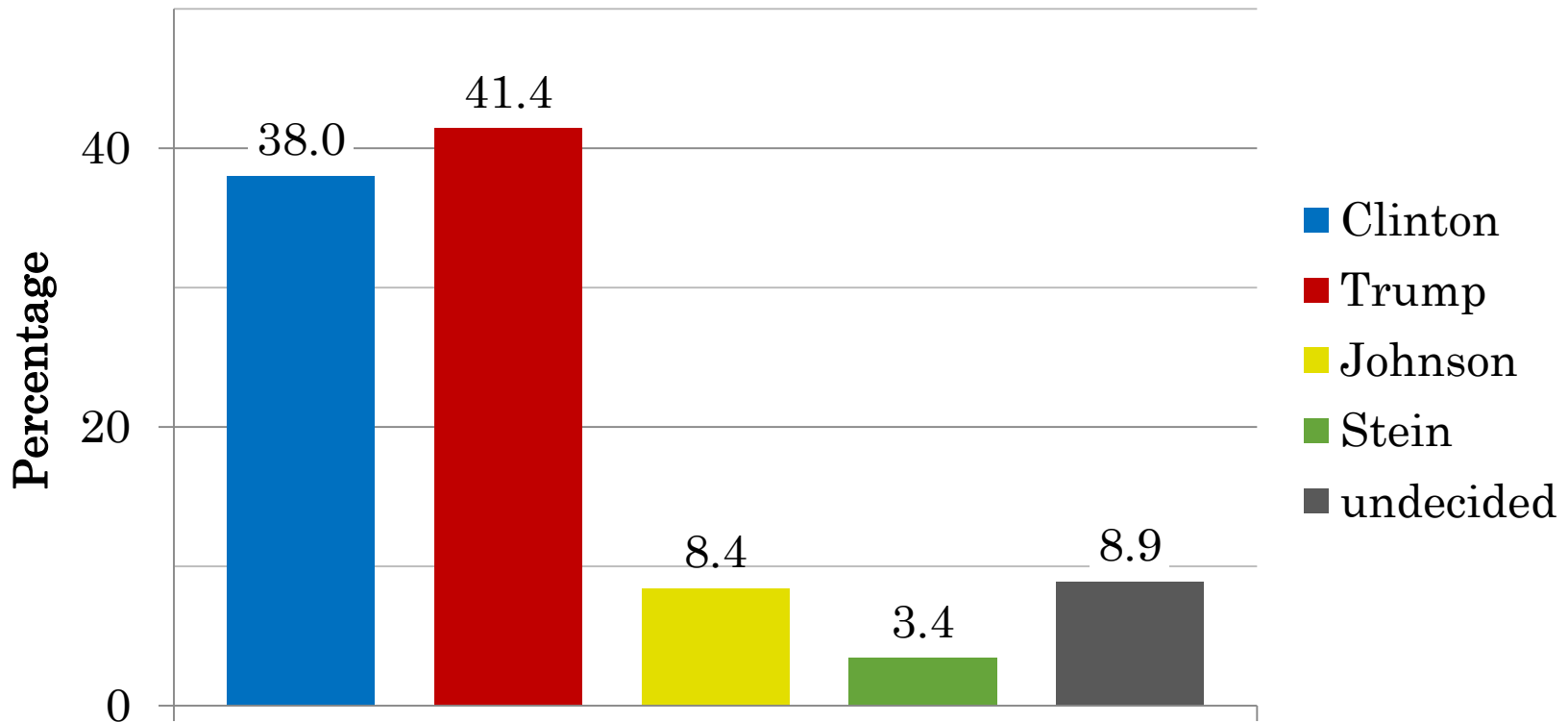
