Methodology

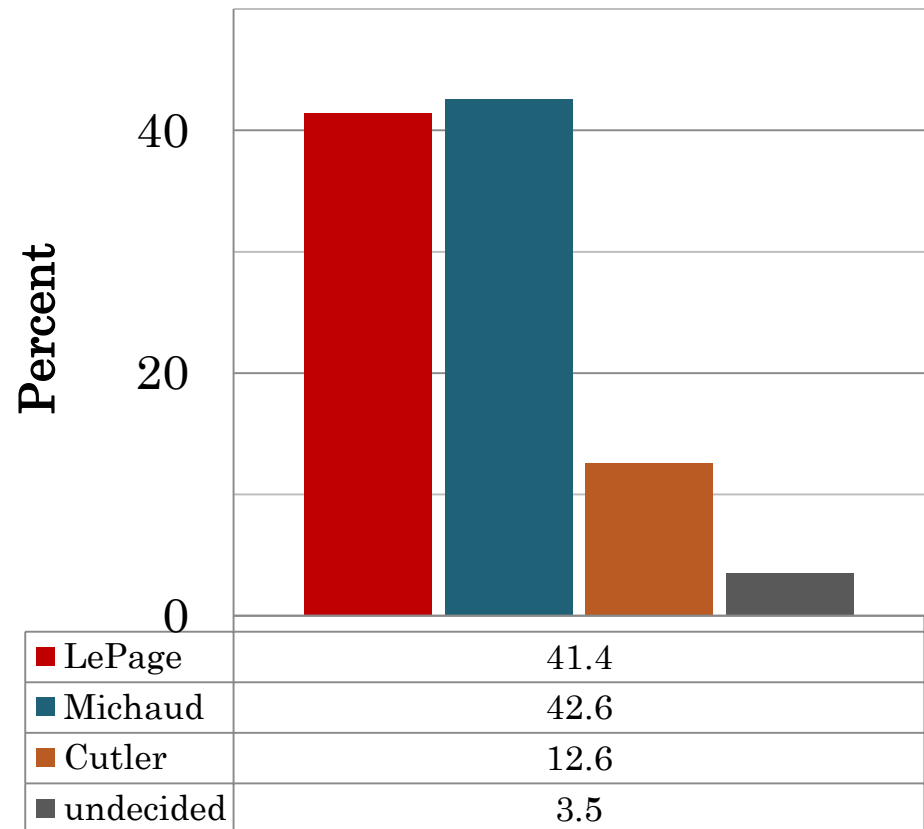
- A survey of 796 likely Maine voters was conducted by interactive voice response from July 26th through 28th, 2013. Calls were made at different times of day to maximize the diversity of possible respondents. Questions were recorded by a female interviewer.
- Survey results were mathematically weighted by gender, age and geographic area to ensure an accurate representation of the population being surveyed. The sample was not weighted by party or ideology.
- The margin of error of this survey is 3.47%, 95 times out of 100. Sub-samples may have a larger margin of error.
- Frequencies and percentages may not always add up to the total number of responses or to 100%, due to weighting and rounding.

MPRC is a non-partisan, non-profit organization dedicated to giving people, especially those groups that are under-represented in civic life, skills and information to participate in the decision-making processes that affect them.

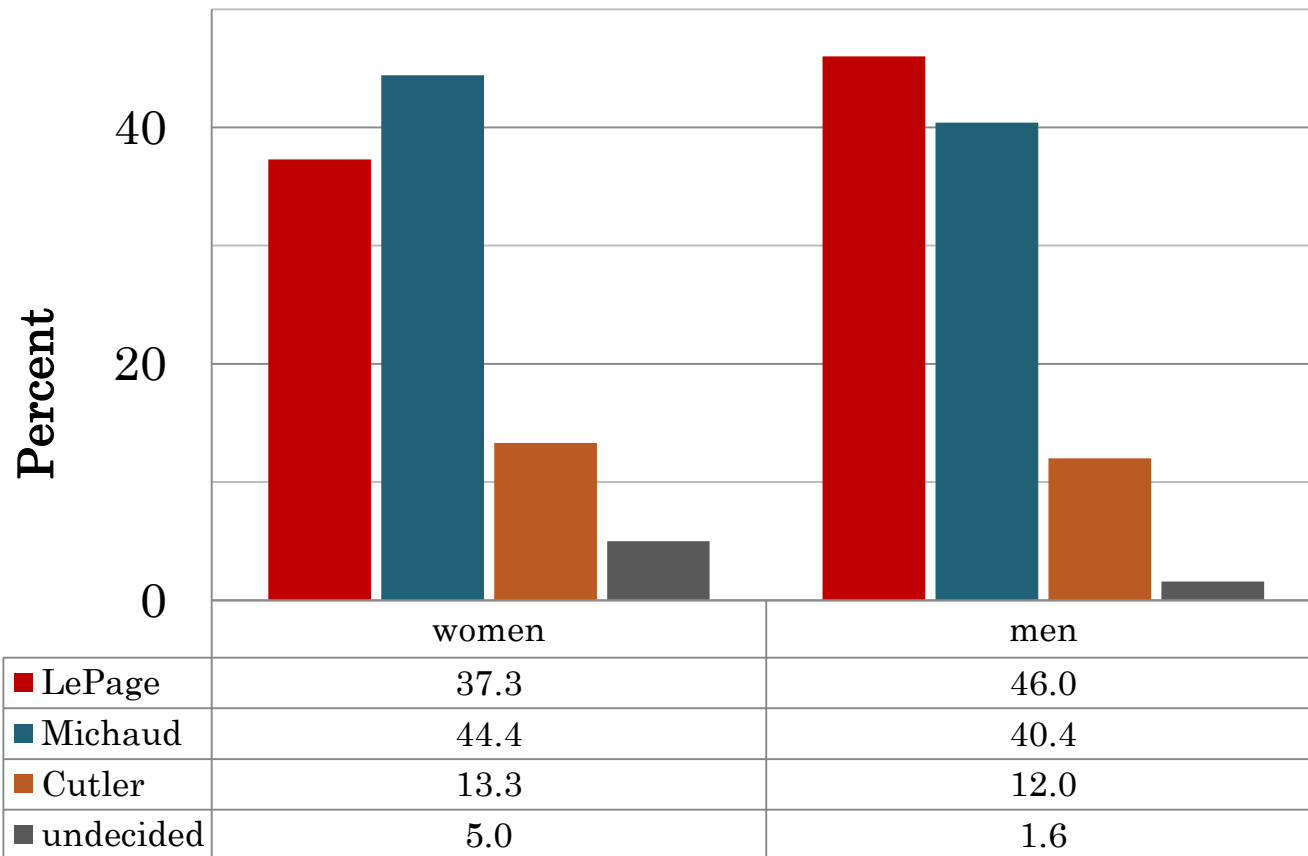

Governor by Gender

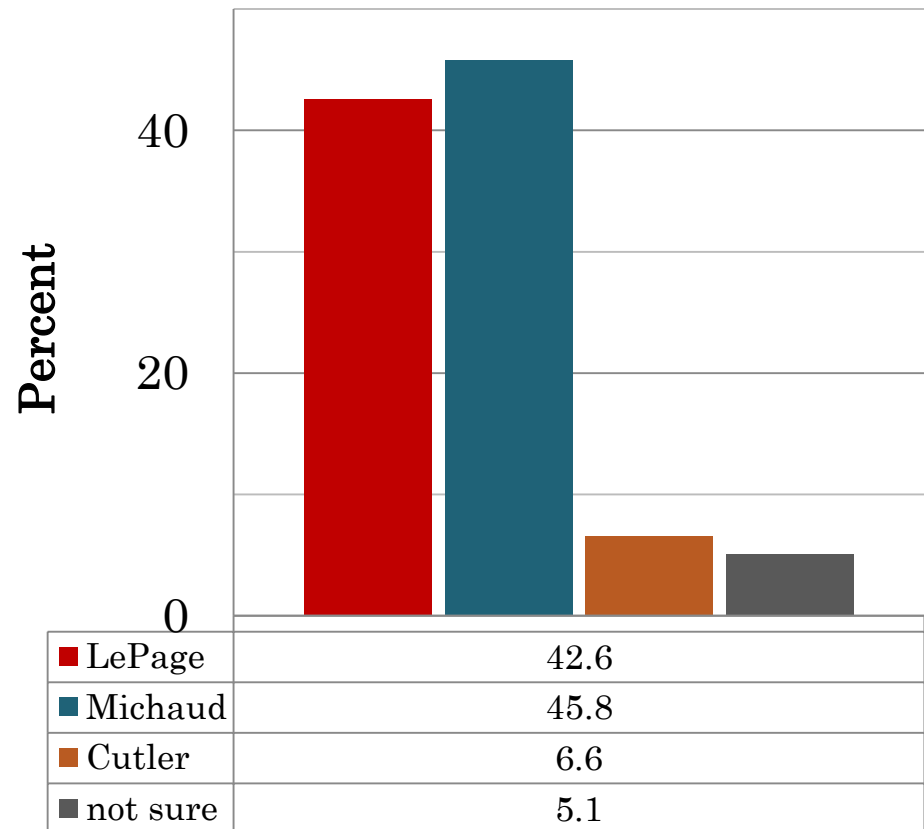

Governor - Likelihood

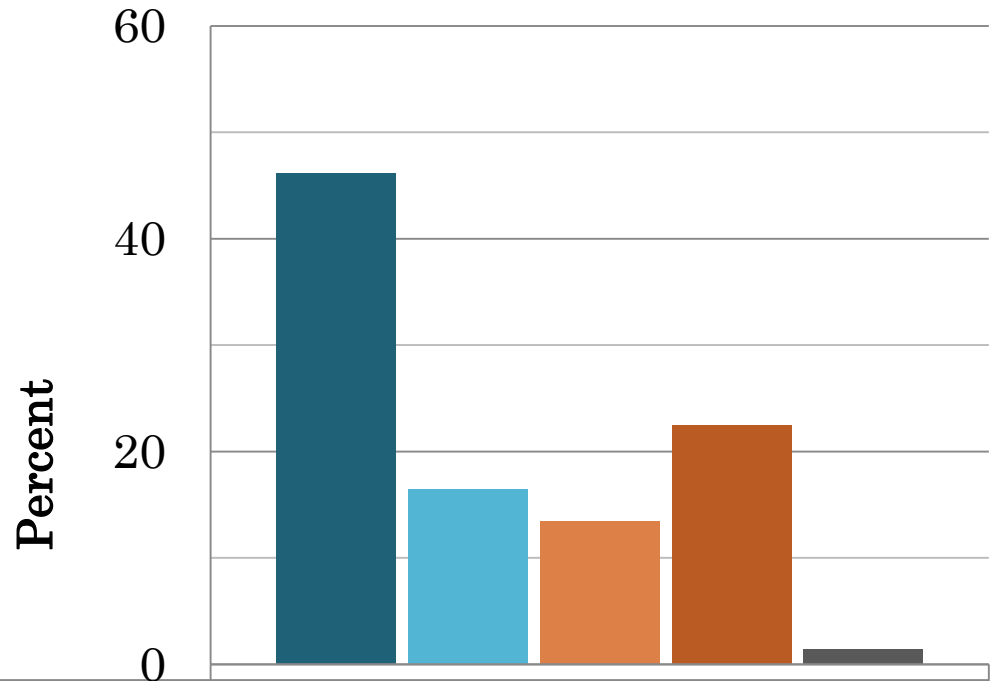

- Regardless of who you are voting for, which candidate do you think is most likely to win the 2014 election for Governor?



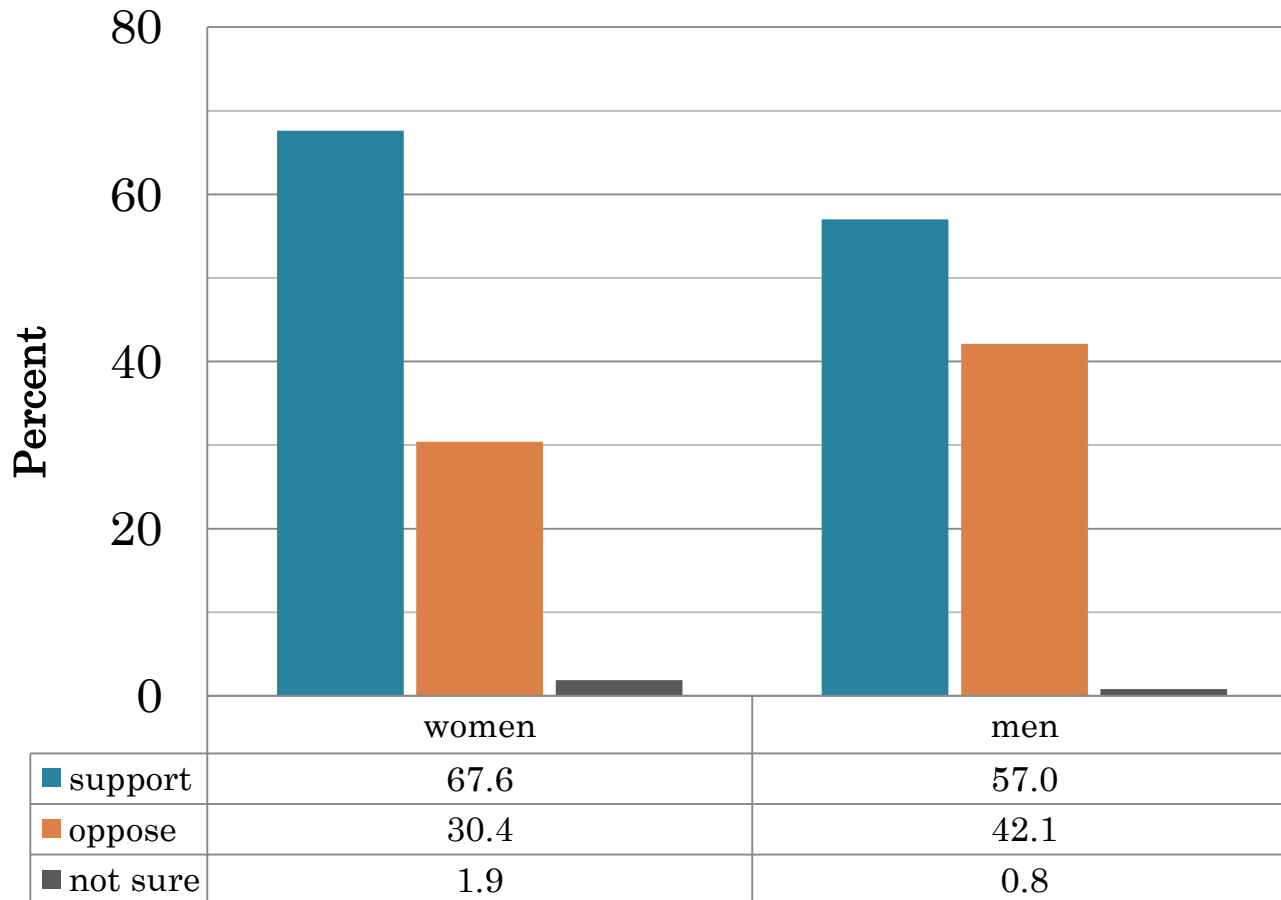
Minimum Wage

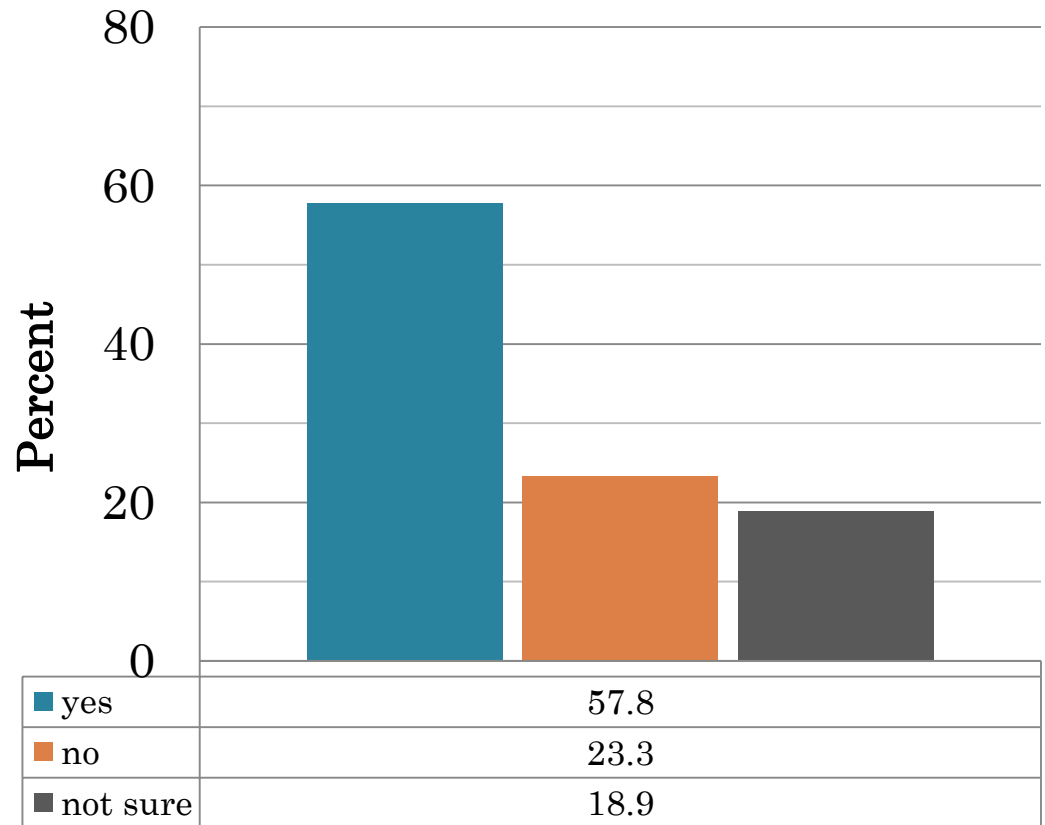

Tipped Workers

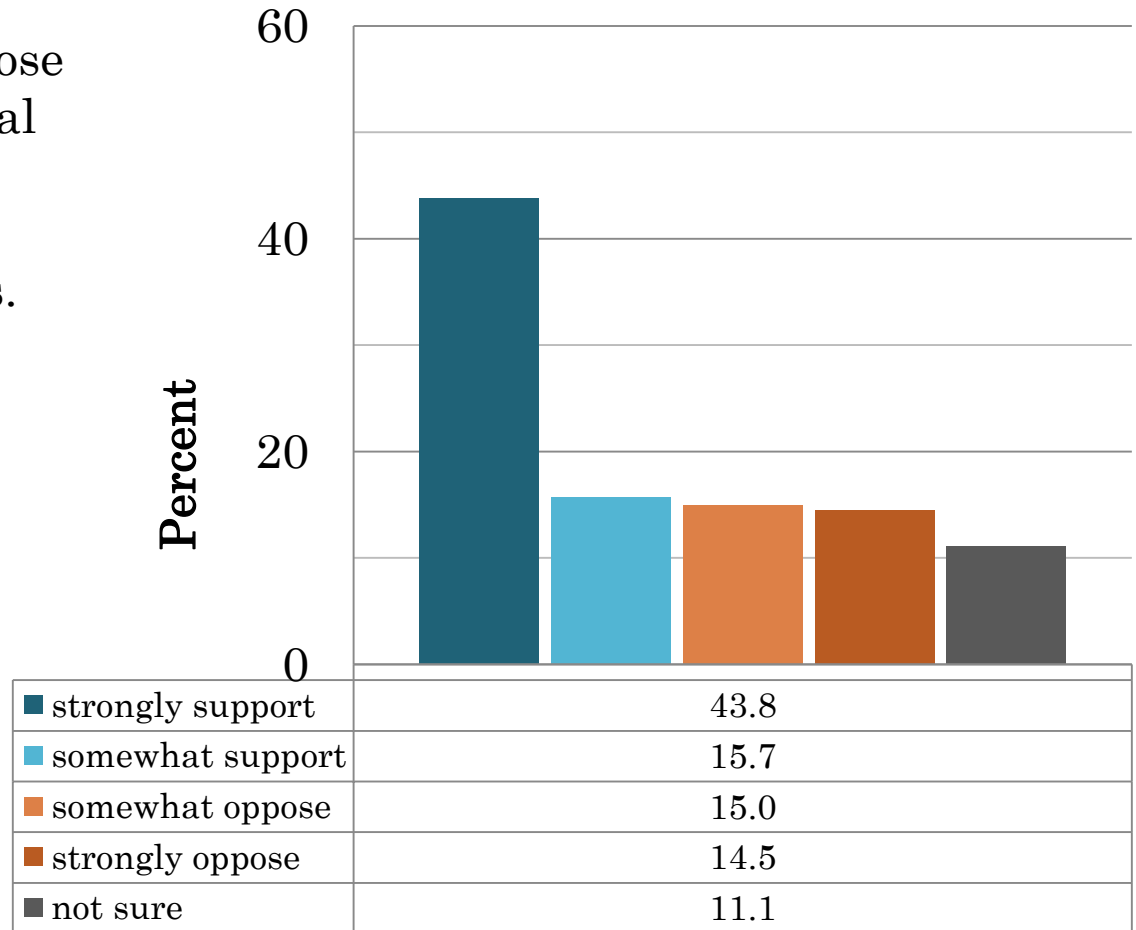
- Do you believe that tipped workers, like restaurant staff, should be included in this raise?

Accepting Federal Health Care Funds

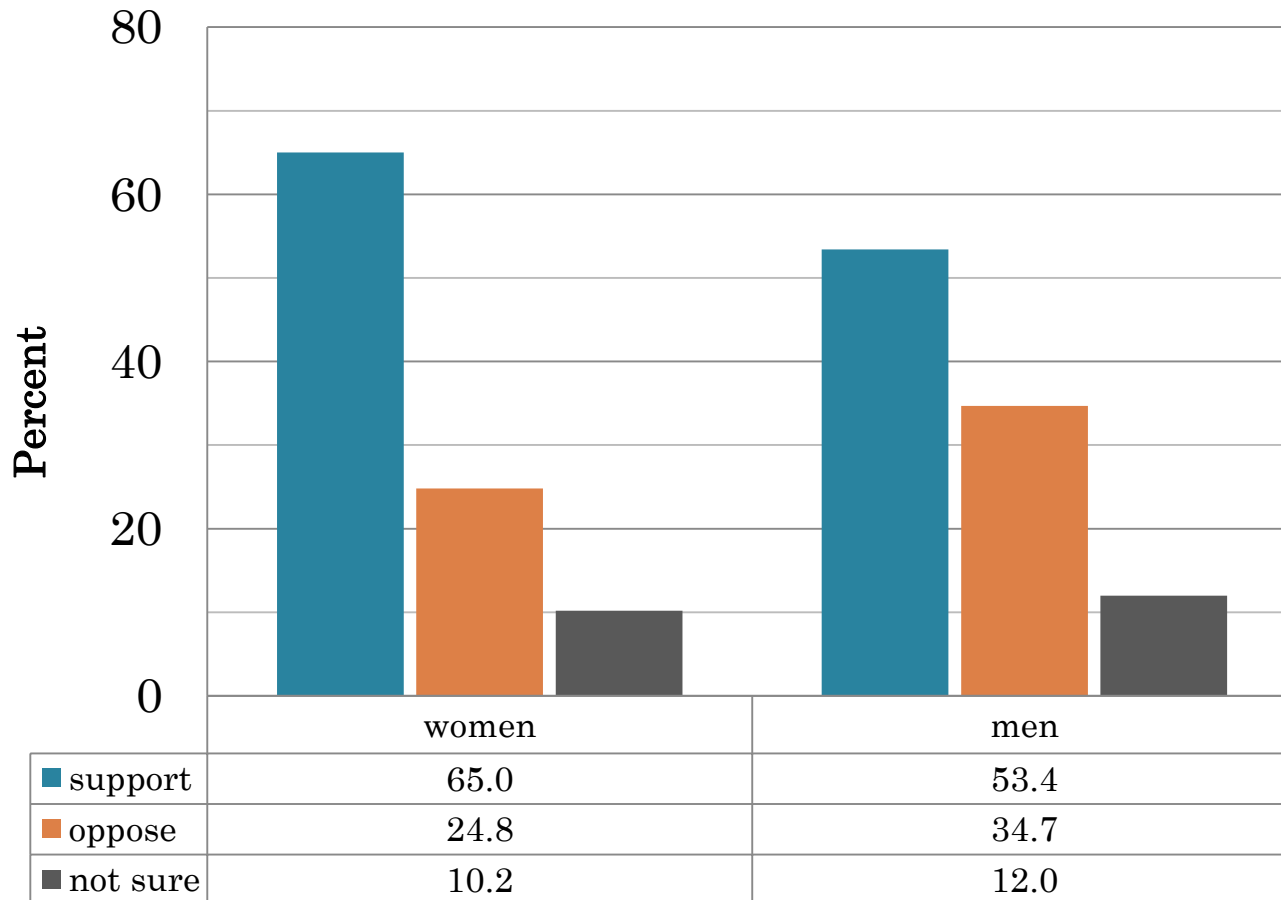

Health Care Funds by Gender

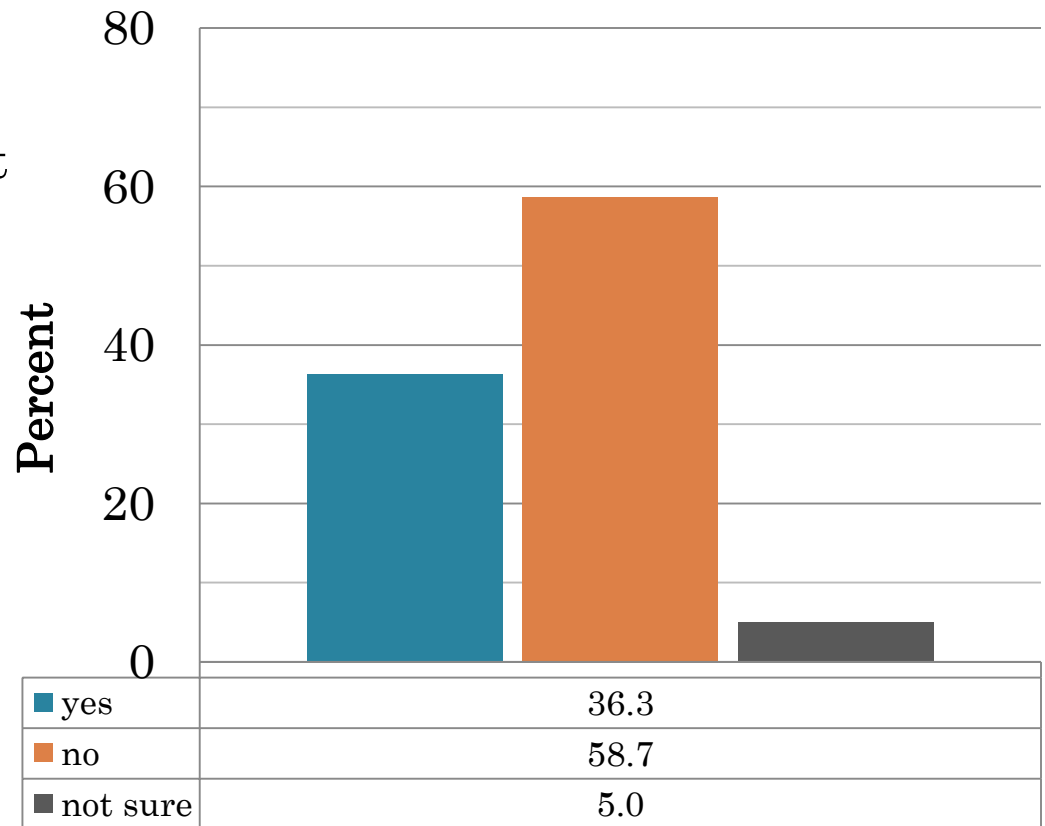

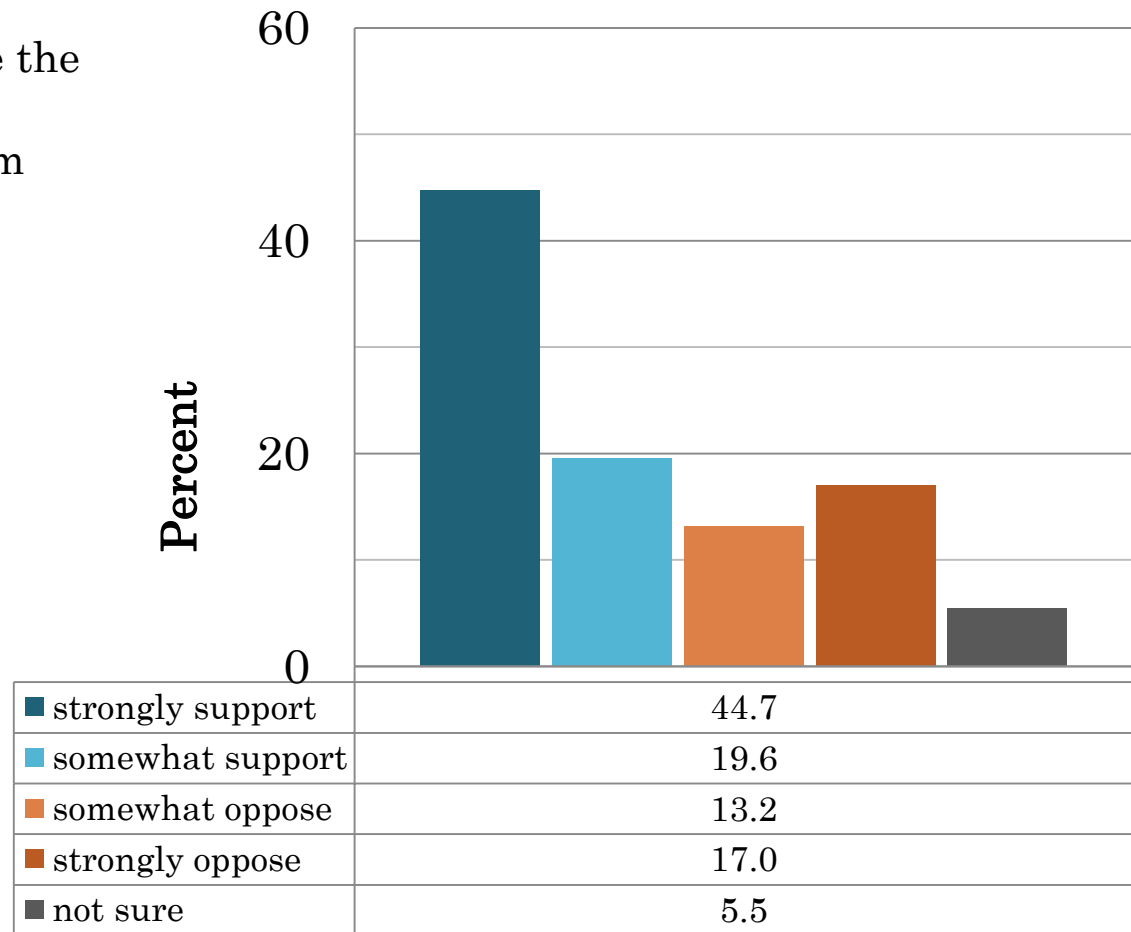
- In the past twelve months, have you or a member of your family put off any sort of medical treatment because of the costs you would have to pay?

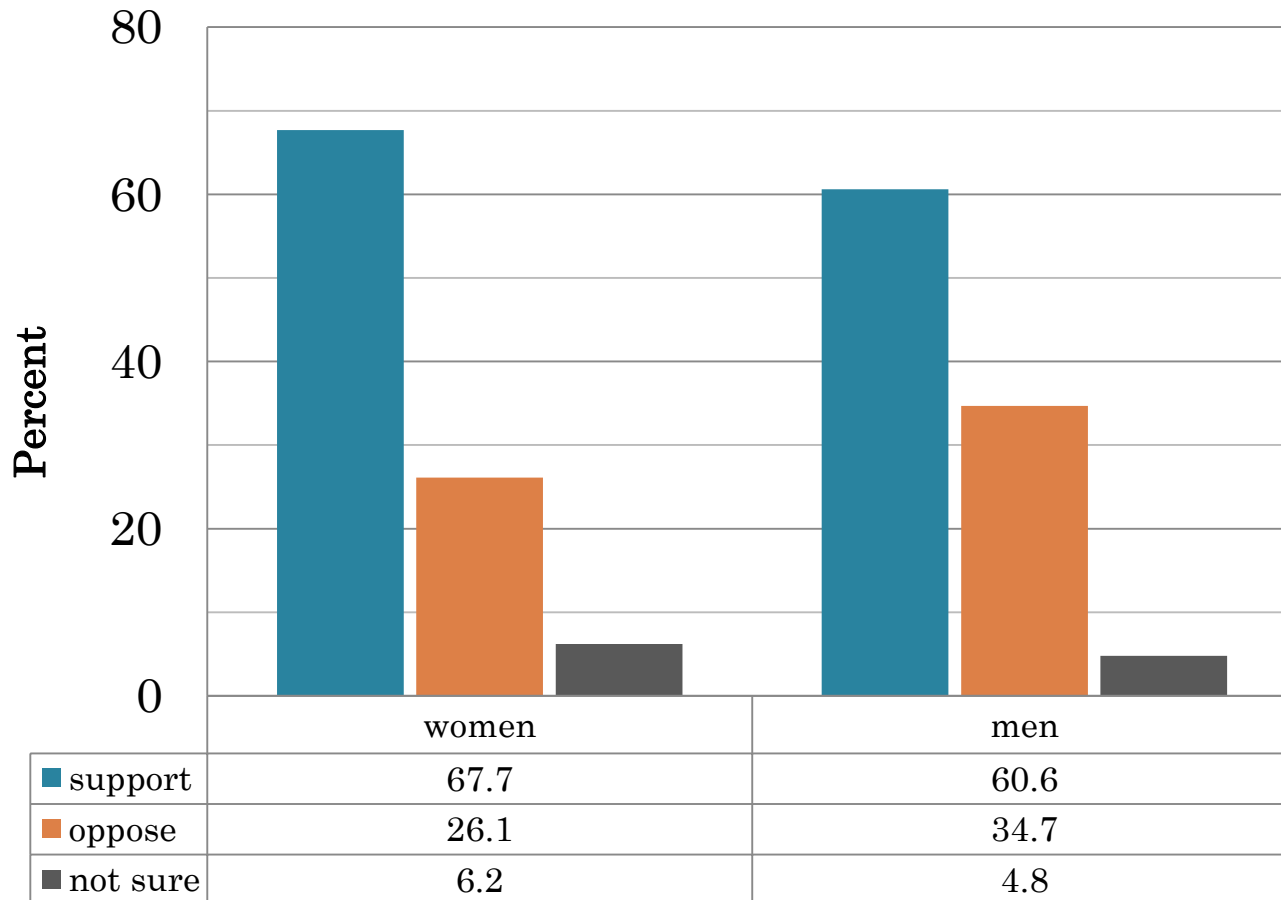

Pre-Kindergarten by Gender

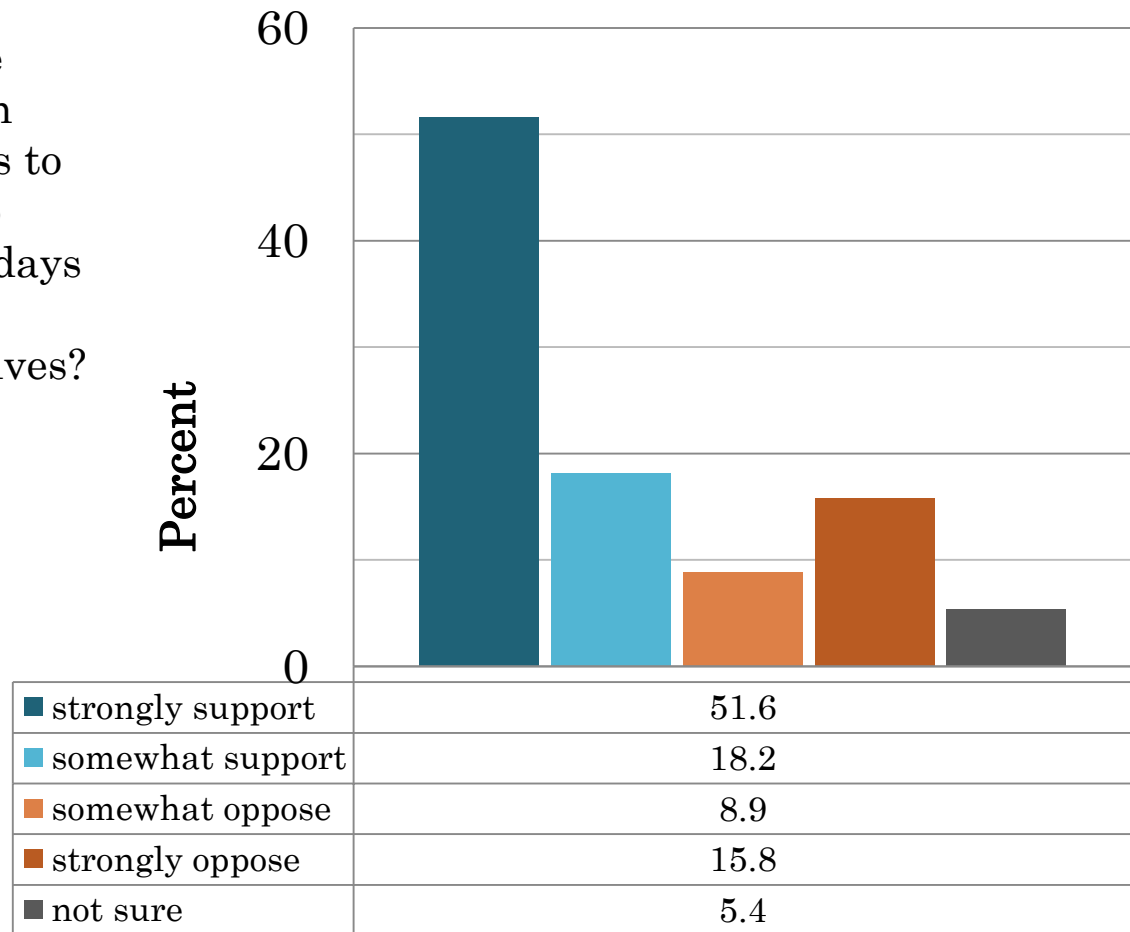

Paid Sick Days

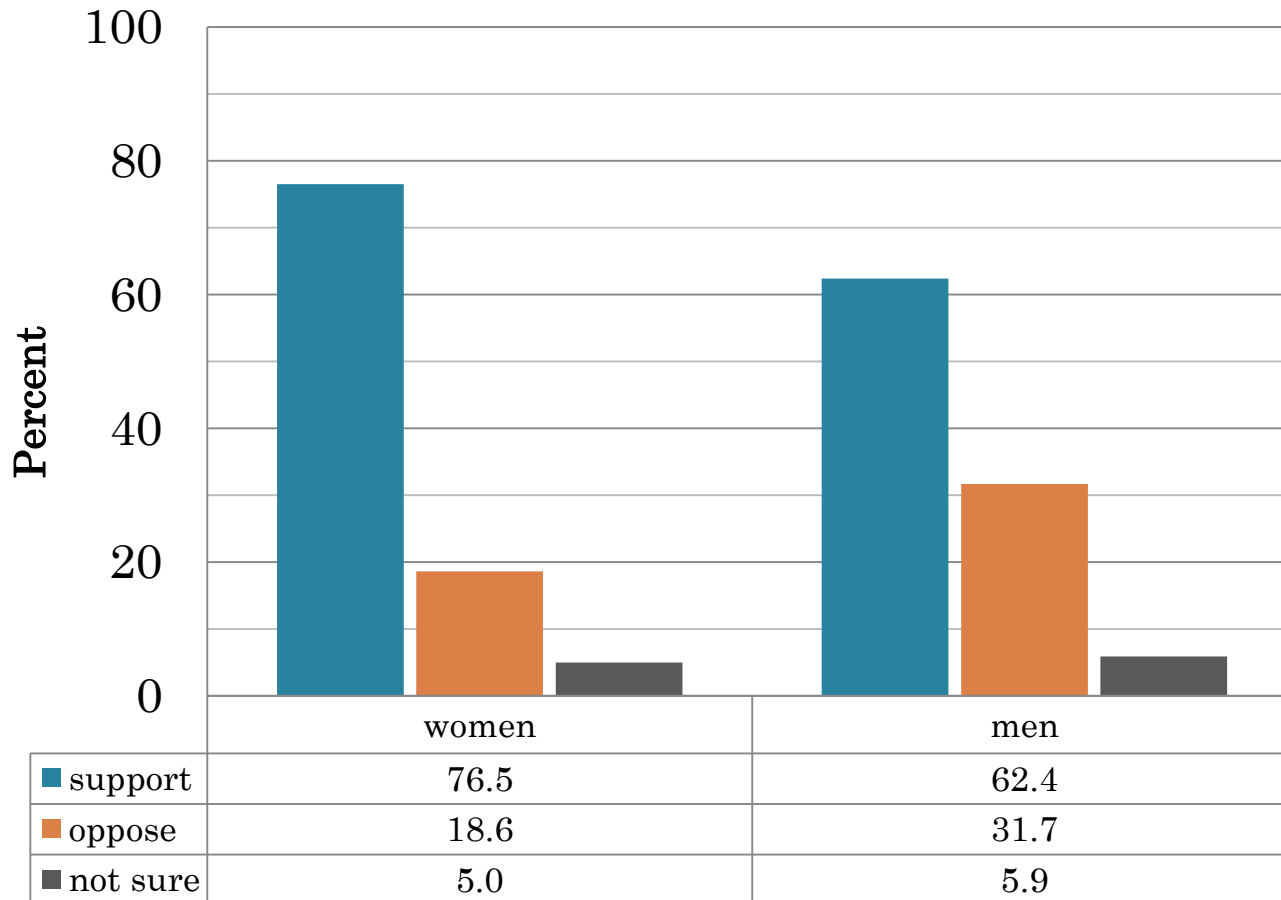

Paid Sick Days by Gender

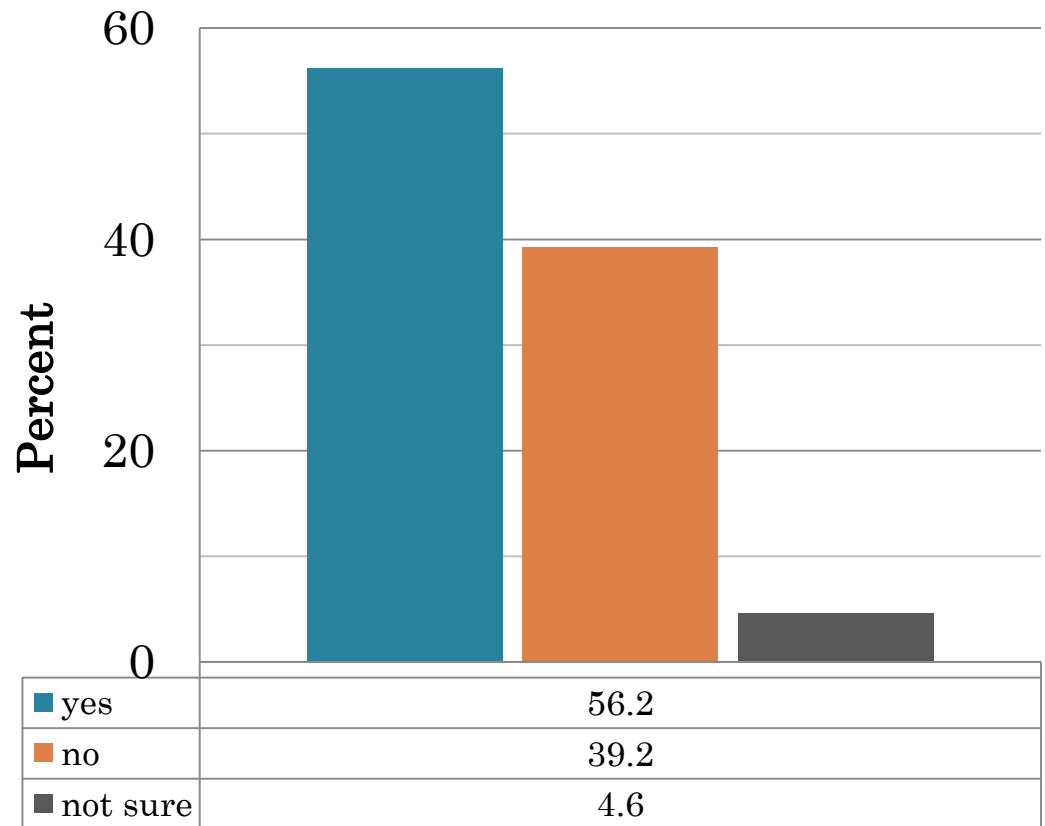

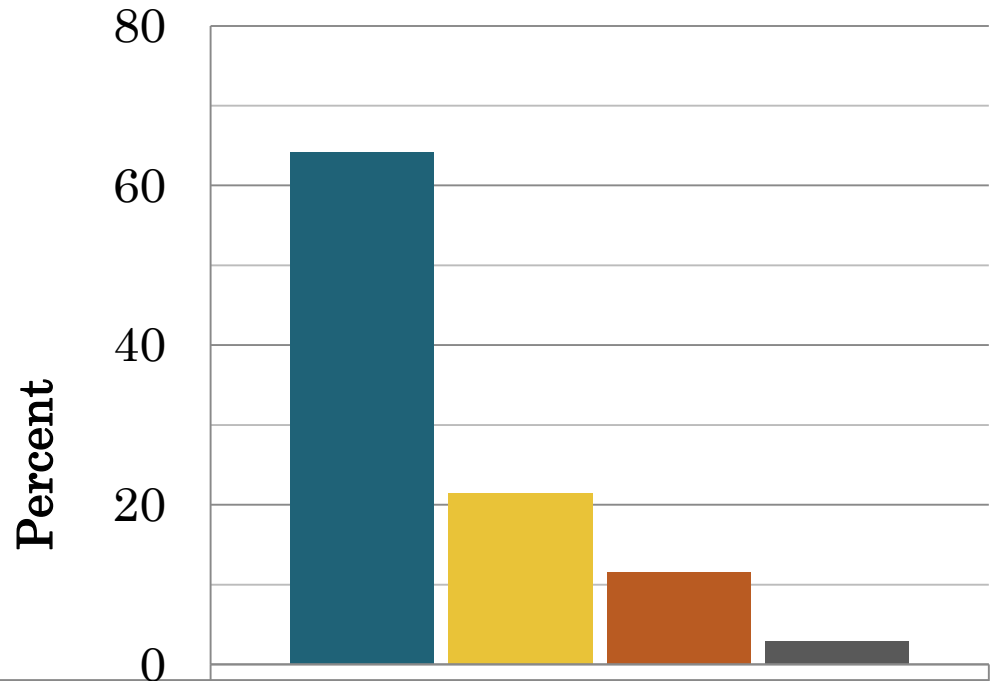
- Have you ever worked when you were sick because you couldn't afford to take time off?



Aging in Place

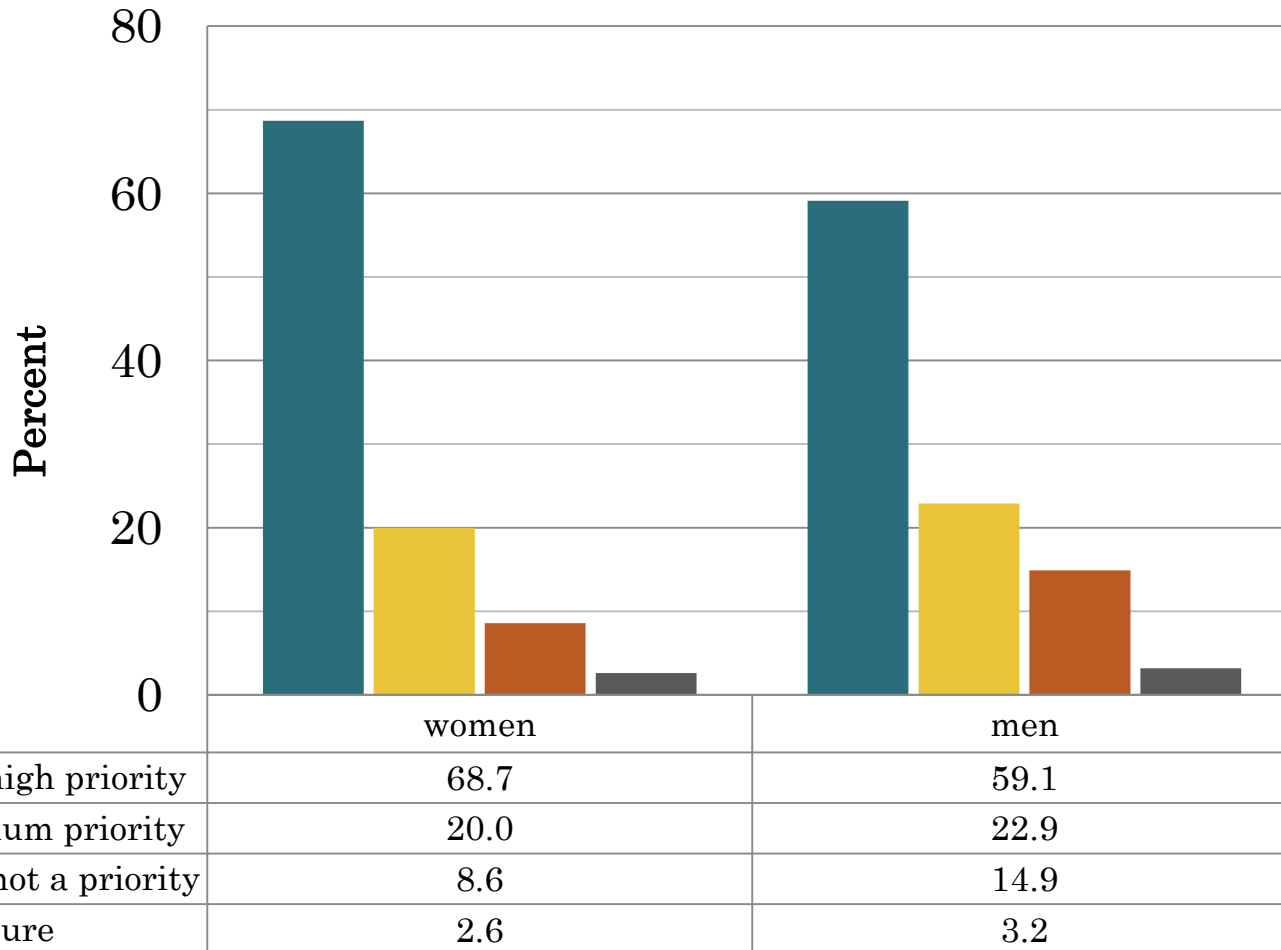

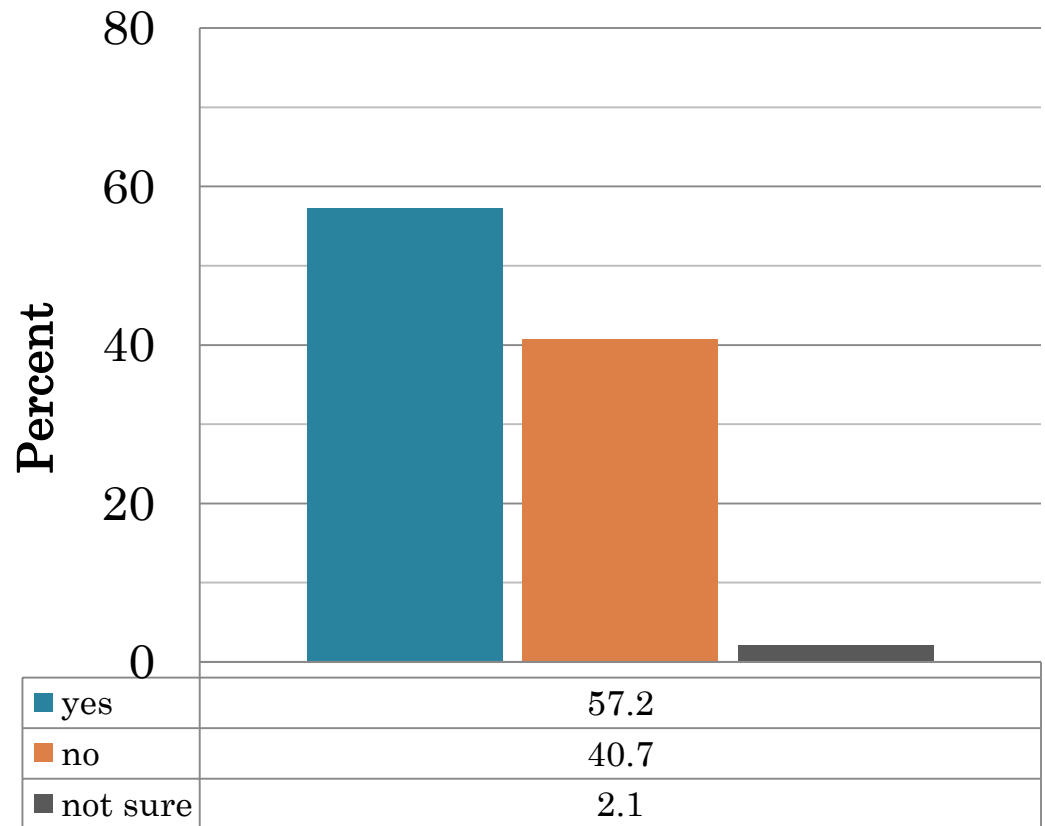

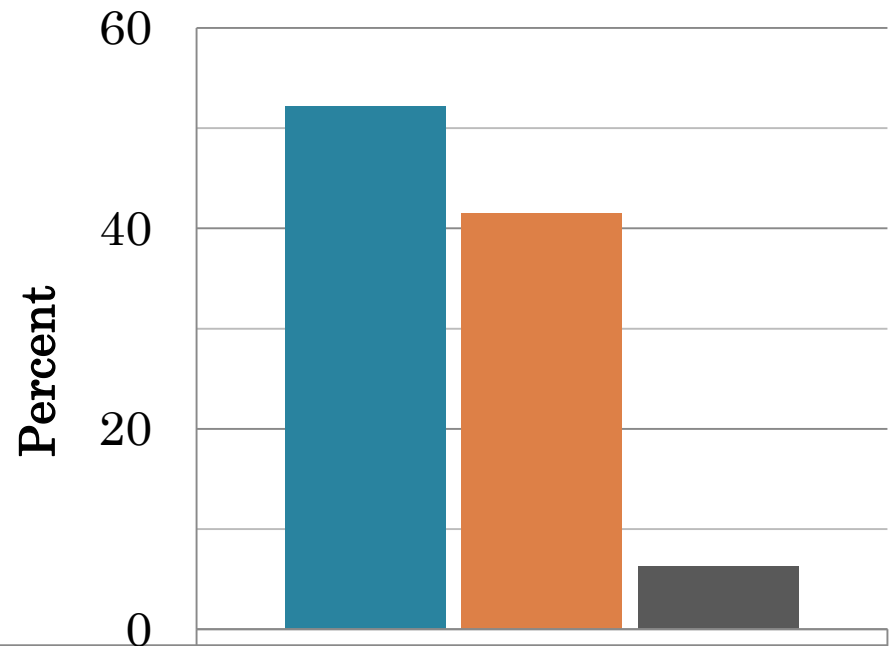

Birth Control

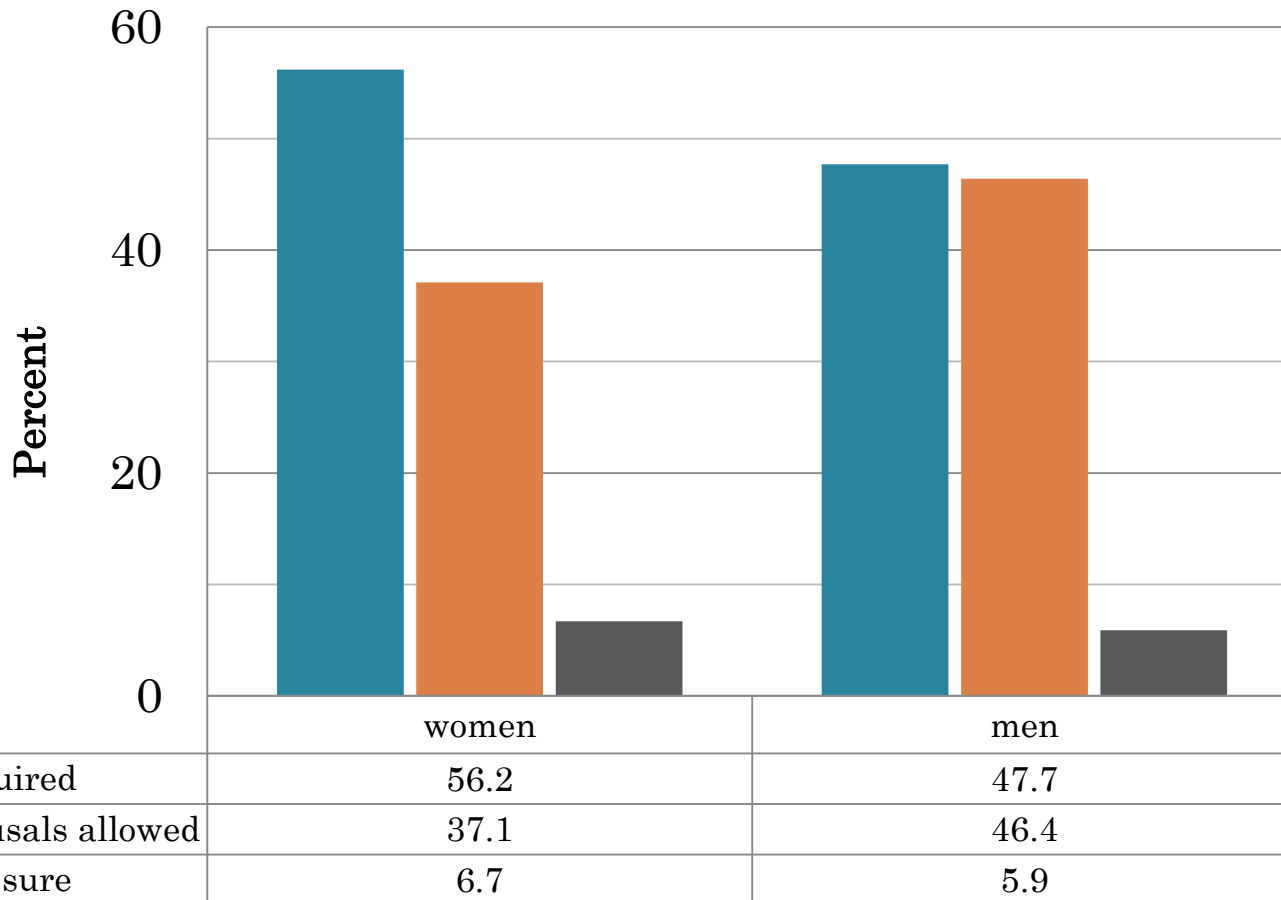
