

MAINE PEOPLE'S RESOURCE CENTER PUBLIC OPINION SURVEY


Methodology

- A survey of 993 registered Maine voters in likely voter households was conducted by interactive voice response from March 31st through April 2nd, 2012. Calls were made at different times of day to maximize the diversity of possible respondents. Questions were recorded by a female interviewer.
- Survey results were mathematically weighted by gender, age and geographic area to ensure an accurate representation of the population being surveyed. The sample was not weighted by party or ideology.
- □ The margin of error of this survey is 3.11%, 95 times out of 100. Subsamples may have a larger margin of error.
- □ Frequencies and percentages may not always add up to the total number of responses or to 100%, due to weighting and rounding.


Obama Approval

- Real Clear Politics national average: 48.0/46.5




LePage Approval

- □ 41.1/52.7/6.2 May 11 44.3/46.0/9.7 - Nov 11




Presidential Preference

- Real Clear Politics national average: 47.6/43.3




President by Congressional District






First Congressional District

 would you vote for?






Second Congressional District

If there were an election for Congress today and the candidates were Democrat Mike Michaud and Republican Kevin Raye, who would you vote for?




Republican U.S. Senate Primary


Democratic U.S. Senate Primary




U.S. Senate – Test Named Matchup

Senate Preference by Party ID




Equal Marriage
