Methodology

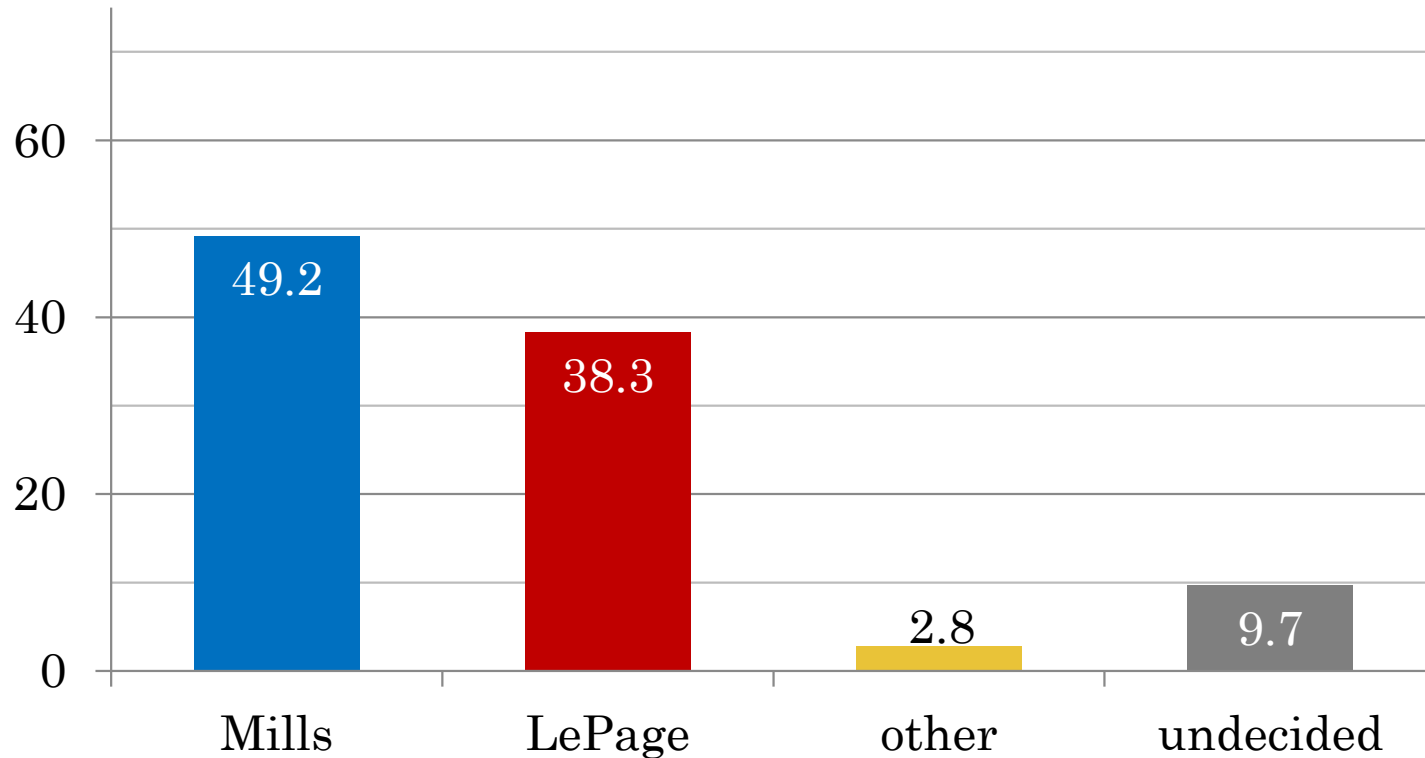

- A survey of 814 Maine voters was conducted by phone and online in September, 2022.
- Survey results were mathematically weighted by gender, age, geographic area and educational attainment to ensure an accurate representation of the population being surveyed.
- The sample margin of error of this survey is 3.4%, 95 times out of 100. Sub-samples may have a larger margin of error.
- Frequencies and percentages may not always add up to the total number of responses or to 100%, due to weighting and rounding.

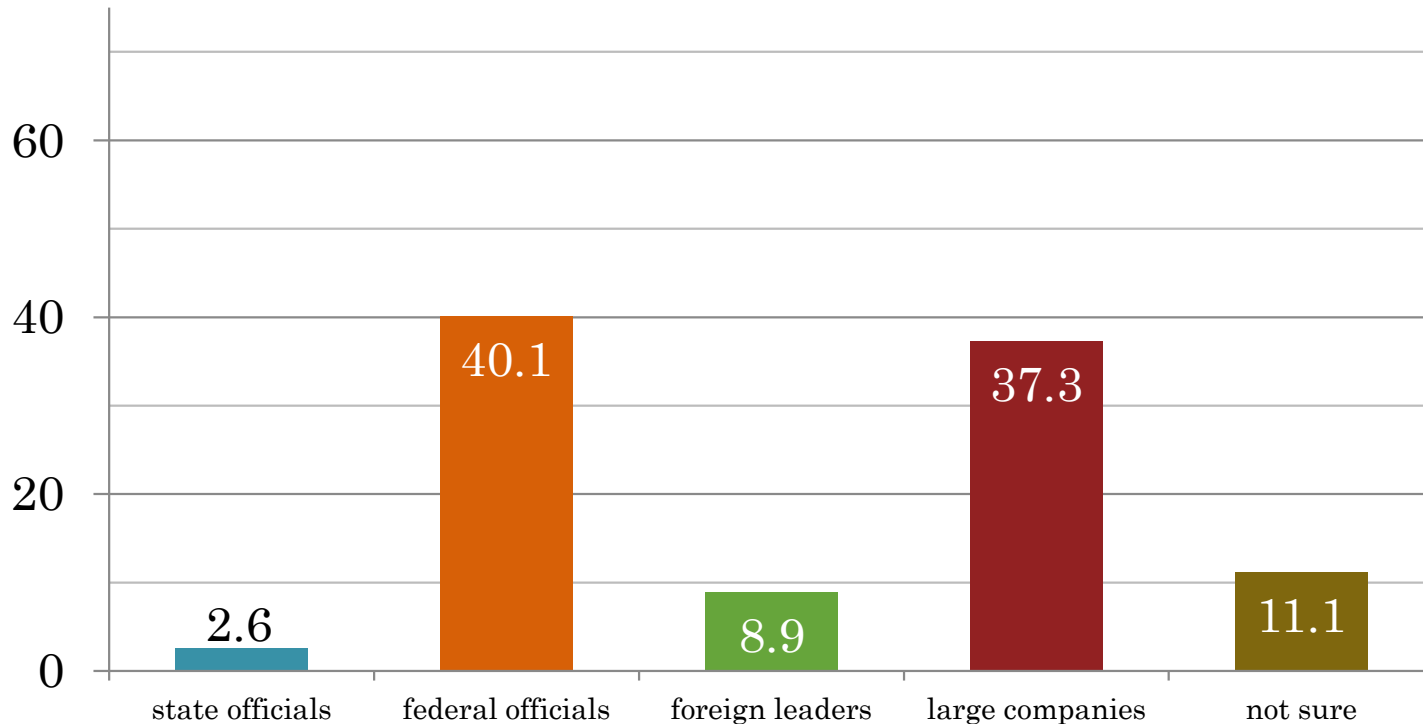

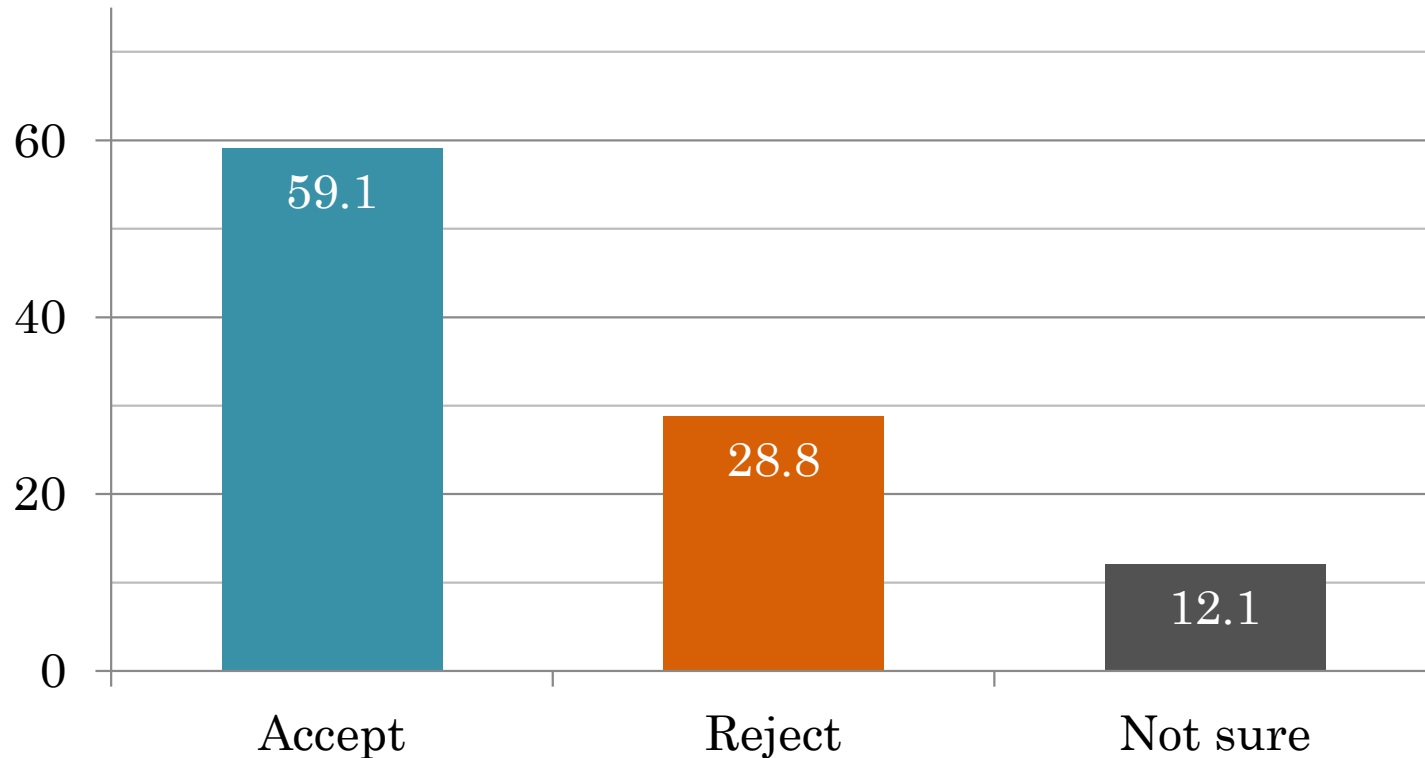


Recently, prices charged for gas, groceries, electricity and other goods have risen. Who do you think is most responsible for these price increases?

Medicaid expansion

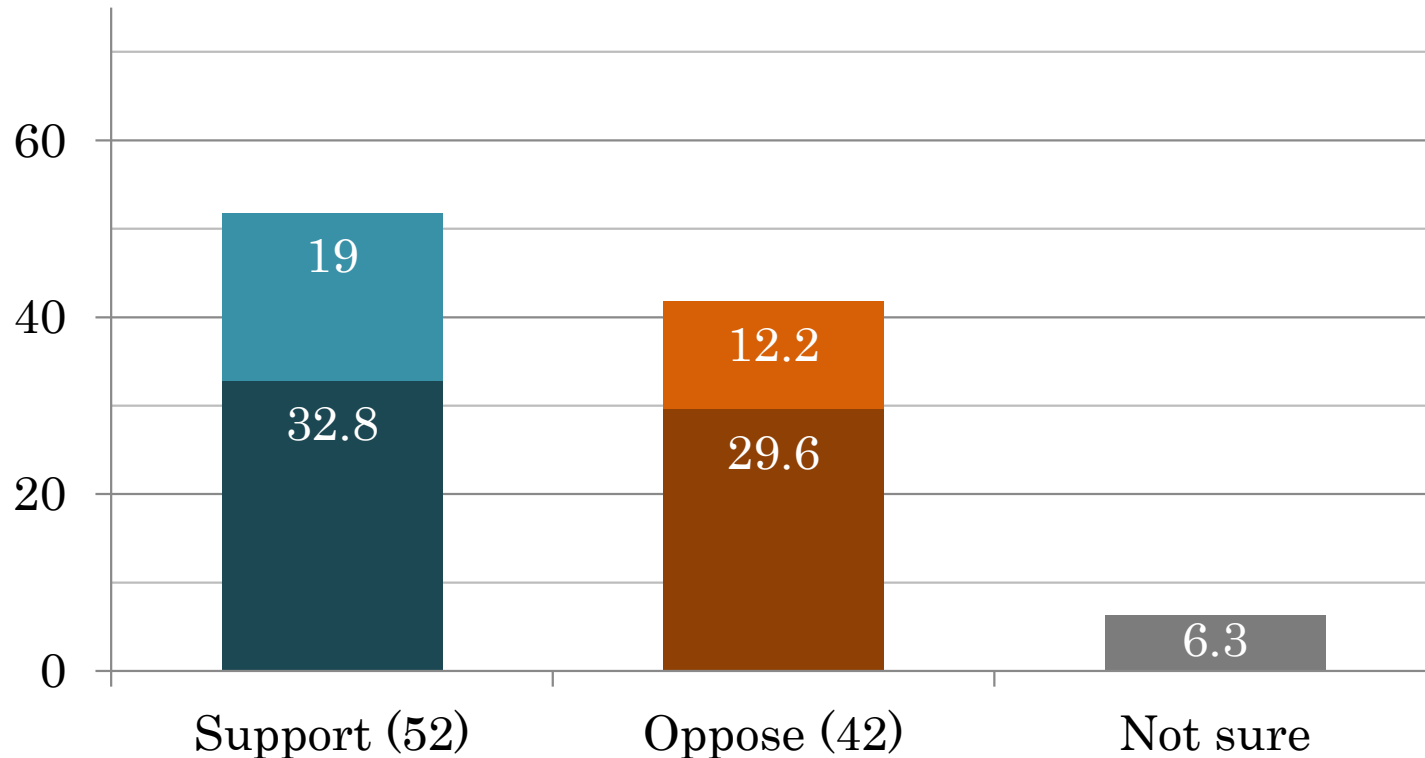

Immigrant health expansion

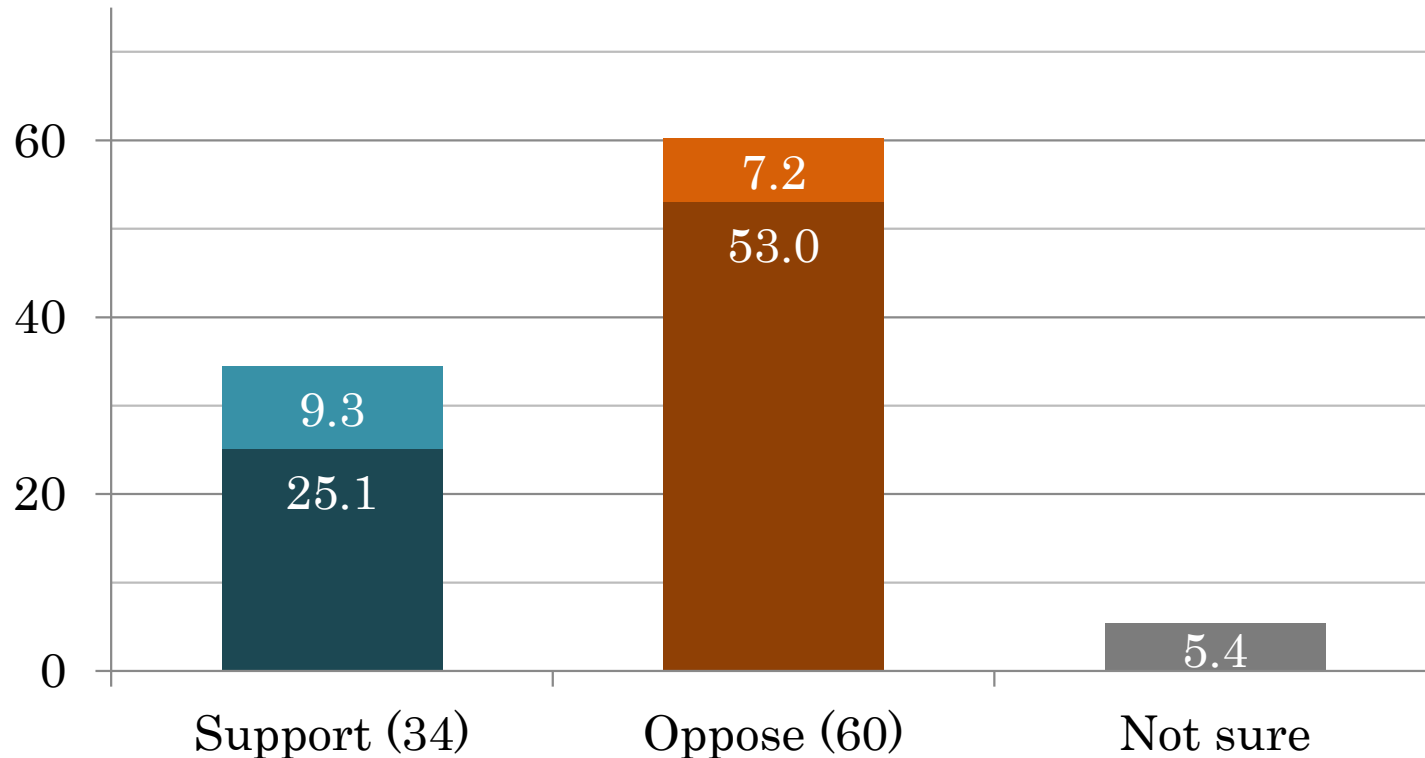

Supreme Court abortion decision

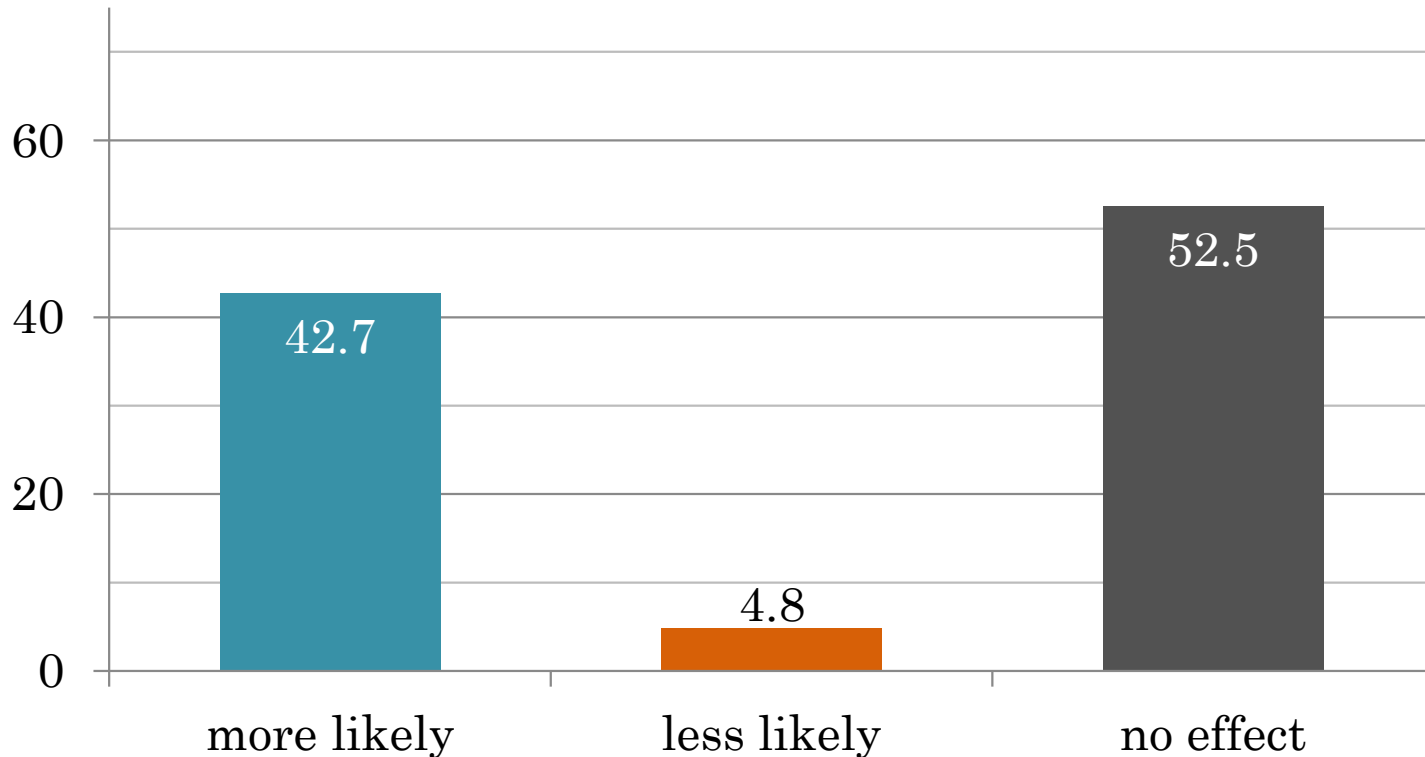

Abortion decision voting effect

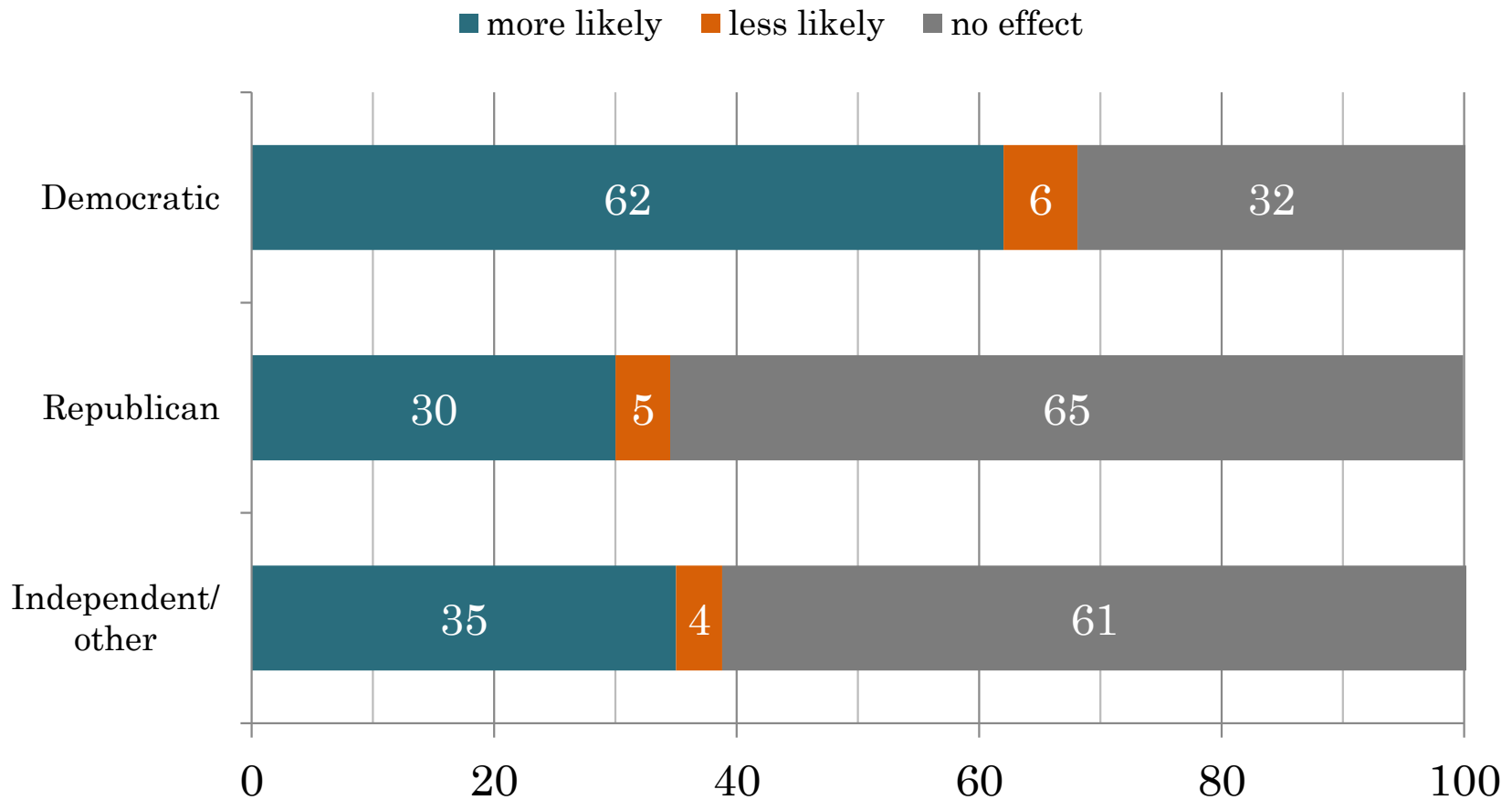
